

NEWS FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

*****Beginning July 1, 2018 New York State requires that all public school students have a physical when they enter grades pre-k, kindergarten, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11. If you have questions, please contact your school nurse.

***** **Sport physical sign-ups are May 1 – June 20**. Please register through Family ID online via the Horseheads Central School District Athletics website. The dates for **sport physicals are June 27th**, **8AM to 12PM and July 2nd**, **8AM to 12PM**. Students will enter through the auditorium doors and proceed to the cafeteria area at their appointment time.

*****A physical dated on or after August 1, 2017 is required to be eligible for a fall sport.

*****JV and V fall sports sign-ups begin **July 14** through Family ID.

*****JV and V fall tryouts begin **August 13.**

*****The end of the school year is quickly approaching! New York State regulations require all medication left at school at the end of the school year be discarded. This includes inhalers and Epi-pens. Unless your child has current permission to self-carry their medication, the school is not able to allow your child to bring the medication home themselves. If you need to make special arrangements to pick up medication, please call the Health Office. <u>Medications not picked up will be disposed of on June 20, 2018 by 11:30am.</u>

This notice is in compliance with provisions of the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 to inform you that, because your child's school received Title I federal funding, you have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's classroom teachers. IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS OF NEXT YEAR'S SENIORS: MENINGOCOCCAL VACCINE(S) REQUIRED BY START OF SCHOOL YEAR IN SEPTEMBER

Beginning September 1, 2017, all students entering 7th and 12th grades in New York State must be fully vaccinated against meningococcal disease in order to attend school. **Students who are not up-to-date will not be allowed to attend school until they are vaccinated.***

Parents, please note Before school this September:

- Your 12th-grader must have received **two doses of the meningococcal vaccine unless he/she received the first dose after turning 16.** Most students entering 12th grade got their first dose when they were younger and are now due for their second dose, or booster. This booster is needed because protection from the vaccine decreases over time.
- If your child had one or two doses of the meningococcal vaccine prior to his/her 16th birthday, he/she must have a second dose in order to begin school in September.*

It's best to check with your doctor to see whether or not your child needs the vaccine. The vaccine may be given by your primary provider or the Chemung County Health Department. For information on how to get the vaccine at the Health Department and particular insurance coverage, call 737-2028.

About the Vaccine:

- It's not a new vaccine; it has been recommended for a decade.
- What's new is that the vaccine will be **required** for school entry as of September 1, 2017.
- Most parents already choose to vaccinate their children.

About Meningococcal Disease:

- It causes **bacterial meningitis** and other serious diseases.
- Teens and young adults are at greater risk.
- It comes on quickly and without warning.
- Its symptoms are similar to the flu.
- Every case of this disease can result in death or long-term disability.

*Public Health Law requires that all students meet immunization requirements. Students transferring within New York State have 14 calendar days to submit required immunizations. Students transferring from out of state or out of country have 30 days to submit required immunizations

JUNE 2018 EXAMINATION SCHEDULE

Please read and save this information for future reference regarding the June Examination Schedule for Classroom Final exams, Regents exams, Regents Competency Tests. Teachers will give students information about the examinations in each class. Please encourage your student(s) to prepare well for the examinations in order to successfully complete the second half of the school year.

This examination schedule will be in effect from **Tuesday**, **June 12 through Thursday**, **June 21**, **2018**. During this period, students will only report to school for their examinations at the times scheduled below. All testing will be held in the North and South Wing of the High School. Students who must take the Regents Competency Tests will be given letters in homeroom with pertinent information about the date, time, and location of the examination.

Cafeteria services will be limited during the six-day examination period. The bus schedule will be maintained as if regular classes were in session. The North Cafeteria and the Library will be open for student use during the examination period.
