

Gardner Road's 50th Anniversary




Saturday, June 11, 2016 9:00 AM - 11:30 AM

Attention Teachers! Summer Camp Opportunity

Do you know a female student who is interested in science and/or the outdoors and would like to attend a weeklong summer camp?

Tanglewood is looking for 20 girls ages 9-12 to attend our 10th *Meg Lowman Treetops Camp* the week of July 18th-22nd from 10am-3pm. We will provide tuition (depending on need), lunch and possibly transportation (if needed) for the week.

We created the camp with several goals in mind:

- 1. To provide strong female mentoring to girls
- 2. To introduce the scientific method in various ways throughout the week and to teach the young women to use it not only in science, but also in other areas of their lives
- 3. To get the girls outdoors and to foster an appreciation for our natural world, using Meg Lowman as an example of a successful local woman who has dedicated her life to working for the betterment of the environment.

The 5-day Camp will cover a variety of topics including:

- ▶ DAY 1- Monday July 18th: Introduction to Scientific Method and Field Studies- Dr. Lynn Gillie, Elmira College, Question and Answer w/Dr. Kelly Hume, DVM
- > DAY 2-Tuesday July 19th: Water- Melissa Yearick of the USRBC
- DAY 3-Wednesday July 20th: Temperate Forest Studies- Dr. Forrest Meekins, Elmira College, Career Panel and Science Activity- Corning Women Engineers
- DAY 4-Thursday July 21st: Crafting w/Natural Objects- Fibers & Spinners Group, Spa Day
- ▶ DAY 5-Friday July 22nd: Tree climbing with Cornell Outdoor Education and Lecture w/Dr. Meg Lowman

Each day will include a ½ hour lunch, afternoon snack and time for discussion and just getting to know each other. Tanglewood has a variety of live animals that we use for programming and they will be incorporated each day, where appropriate.

Is she someone who has an interest in science that needs to be nurtured?

Is she a lover of the outdoors or does this need to be encouraged?

Is she in need of positive female role models?

Is she someone who would benefit from a special week?



Who is Meg Lowman?

Meg Lowman, PhD

Margaret D. Lowman, Ph.D. a.k.a. "Canopy Meg" is an American biologist, educator, ecologist, writer, editor, and public speaker. Her expertise involves canopy ecology, canopy plant-insect relationships, and constructing canopy walkways.

Nicknamed the "Real-Life Lorax" by National Geographic and "Einstein of the Treetops" by the Wall Street Journal, Meg Lowman pioneered the science of canopy ecology. On January 6, 2014 Dr. Lowman joined the California Academy of Sciences as its inaugural Chief of Science and Sustainability. In this role, she is responsible for the Academy's programs of scientific research and exploration. For over 30 years, "Canopymeg" has solved mysteries of insect pests and ecosystem health in the highest layer of the world's forests, designing the tools of the tradehot-air balloons and walkways for treetop exploration- as she went. Her personal mantra is "no child left indoors."
