

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Let us introduce you to 4th Grade.

This brochure was designed to inform parents of the expectations for their child's grade level.

Each teacher has his/her own style of teaching; however, the curriculum is guided by new national Common Core Standards.

Fourth grade is a transitional year, as students are required to be more responsible for their learning, begin to take routine tests and quizzes, and prepare for state tests.



CURRICULUM

• Math - Go Math

<u>Math</u> - Our program emphasizes Common Core Standards. There is a focus on division and decimals as well as problem solving.

• English Language Arts (ELA)

Writing - Students will write for a variety of purposes (**fiction and nonfiction**). Correct grammar, punctuation and spelling will be emphasized.

<u>Reading</u> - Treasures -(a reading program which covers a variety of fiction and nonfiction topics)

- 1. Literature Circles (each student has a role while reading a particular piece)
- 2. Shared Reading (the entire class reads the same story)
- 3. Read Aloud (teacher reads to the class)
- 4. Partner Reading (students are paired up to read to each other)
- 5. Independent Reading (students read books of their choice on their own reading level)
- Science Mini labs created by BOCES as well as teacher-designed units - units include: Life Science - Plants, Animals, Ecosystems, Earth Science - Water, Weather, Earth/Moon/Sun, Physical Science - Energy, Matter
- **Social Studies -** units include: NYS Geography and History, Prehistory, Native Americans, Explorers, Colonial NY, American Revolution, New Nation of NY, Transportation, Urbanization, Immigration, Labor Movement, National, State, Local Government.
