


Be sure to use Parent Portal to help you keep track of your child's grades. Visit the guidance office if you need to sign up.

Students at Horseheads Middle School are scheduled for 10 periods each day and follow an odd- or even-day schedule.

Express Pass

Students who earn an average of 85 or higher will be placed on the Honor Roll. We distribute Honor Roll Certificates to students during 10th period at the end of each marking period. Students who make the Honor Roll and the Quality Party will be awarded an Express Pass. Students may use the Express Pass to visit the cafeteria during 10th period and the library during study halls.

Quality Party

Students meeting the criteria on our Quality Student Poster are invited to the Quality Party supported by the Horseheads Middle School PTO and the Horseheads Youth Bureau.

Prior to the end of each marking period, students receive a Quality Award Card for teachers to sign. A teacher signature indicates the student is Quality in their class.

Students are eliminated from the party if two or more teachers indicate they have not met the criteria on the Quality Student Poster. Students may also be eliminated for inappropriate behavior which results in disciplinary action.

A QUALITY STUDENT At Horseheads Middle School... Is prepared for class, on time and ready to learn. Completes all homework, class work and class projects to the best of their ability. Knows and understands school policies and procedures and accepts the direction of teachers, school officials, and others who have been assigned the responsibility to enforce them. Practices good citizenship, particularly by respecting the rights, privileges and property of others.

New York State now requires all incoming 7th grade students receive one dose of the Meningococcal Vaccine prior to entering the 7th grade school year. Your child will not be able to attend school beginning 9/17/19 without proof of immunization. If you are new to the district, a copy of your student's immunization record is required within 14 days of entry.

Health Information

- All 7th grade students are required to have a physical dated September 4, 2018 or later.
- An Emergency Contact Sheet will be sent out the first week of classes. Please remember to return these forms.
- Vision and hearing screenings will be conducted in the health office for all 7th grade students, unless provided by a private physician.
- We encourage self-carry medication orders for inhalers and EpiPens.
- Inhalers and EpiPens are the only medications that a student is allowed to carry. They must be carried by the student and not put in their locker.
- Physician's order can be obtained to have other medications available in the health office for students to use as prescribed. Examples include: pain relievers and cough drops.
- Routine medication requires a physician's order and parent signature each school year.
- All medications must be delivered to and picked up from the Health Office by a parent.
