


Dignity for All Students Act





School Tours

Horseheads Orientation Program (HOP)

 Students will participate in activities to familiarize themselves with school procedures. They will practice opening lockers and will become more comfortable with the layout of the school.



- The students will have an opportunity to choose from several different one day, two-hour HOP sessions.
- HOP dates will be sent home with students and posted to our website.

Teaming



- Students are divided into three teams (red, white & blue). There are four academic teachers (ELA, math, science and social studies) on each team.
- The team of teachers meets every other day to assess individual student needs, evaluate student achievement and discuss student progress with parents.

 Parent conferences are held during team time and can be requested by contacting your student's guidance counselor.





- Students enrolled in a high school credit bearing course, must be in attendance 85% of the scheduled class periods. Students lose credit on the 29th absence in a course that meets every day all year.

Parent Notification



Horseheads schools use the SchoolMessenger system to deliver text messages, straight to your mobile phone with important information about school closings, safety alerts and more.

You can participate in this service just by sending "Y" Or "Yes" by text to our school's short code number, 67587. You can also opt out of these messages at any time by simply replying to one of our messages with "Stop".

Health Information



 All 7th grade students are required to have a physical dated September 4, 2018 or later.

 An Emergency Contact Sheet will be sent out the first week of classes.



 Vision and hearing testing will be done in the health office for all 7th grade students, unless provided by a private physician.



Health Information



- We encourage self-carry medication orders for inhalers and EpiPens. These must be carried on the student and left in lockers.
- Inhalers and EpiPens are the only medication that a student is allowed to carry.
- Physician's order can be obtained to have other medications, such as pain relievers and ibuprofen, available in the health office.



Health Information Continued



 Routine medication requires a physician's order and parent signature each school year.

 All medications must be delivered to and picked up from the Heath Office.



Health Information Continued



Immunizations:

 If you are new to the district, a copy of your student's immunization record is required within 14 days of entry.

Any updates to the immunization record are appreciated.

Health Information Continued



New York State now requires all incoming 7th grade students receive one dose of the Meningococcal Vaccine prior to entering the 7th grade school year. Your child will not be able to attend school after 14 days, without proof of immunization.

 Sports registration and sign ups must be completed through family ID system. This is a secure platform that provides an easy, userfriendly way to register for our sport programs. The system keeps track of your profile so that you enter information only once for multiple uses, family members and programs.

- All sports physicals for the 2019-2020 school year will be conducted on June 26th and July 2nd. Appointment slots will be filled on a first-come, first-serve basis. Registration for sports physicals will open May 1st and close on June 19th.
- You must register for sports physicals through the Family ID system. See the nurse with questions.
- · No sports physicals will be offered during the school year.
- A current physical is required to play any Modified, JV or Varsity sport.



Athletic Placement Process:

- The Athletic Placement Process procedure timeline is posted on the athletic web site.
- Athletic Placement recommendations must come from a District Coach or Physical Education teacher.
- Any 7th or 8th grade student recommended to play at a JV or Varsity level must meet fitness and skill requirements, as well as the physical maturity component outlined by the Commissioner of Education.



 Athletic Placement paperwork is distributed by the middle school nurse.
 All paperwork must be completed by the established deadlines.

 Paperwork is returned to the Health Office.








Summer PostCard
