FRIENDLY REMINDERS:

• Changes in Going Home Routine/Bus Notes

Please remember to write a 'blue note' with your child's change in dismissal plans if he/she will not be following their normal routine. Blue notes should also be written to explain your child's tardiness, absence, or plan to leave early. This is extremely important for the safety of our students.

• Half Days for Elementary Schools

Kid's World is NOT provided on half days at elementary schools. Please send a blue note on these days with dismissal plans for your student if he/she usually attends Kid's World.

On November 17th, and November 26th dismissal will be at 11: 30am for Pre– K students and K-4 students will be at 11:55am.

Please Always Park in the Parking Lot

When visiting the school, either with a late student/ early pick up, dropping something off, attending a meeting, etc., please always park in the parking lot and not the bus lane. All visitors must report to the office, and the office will further assist you.

• Please Write Names on Lunch Boxes!

Lunch boxes have been brought to the office with no name on them after being left on the bus or in the cafeteria rooms. Please write your child's first and last name somewhere in or on the lunch box so we can get it back to them as soon as possible! Thank you.

School and Emergency Closings

School closings due to inclement weather will be announced via text, phone, and various media outlets such as WNKI, WPGI, Magic FM, and WELM radio stations, and WENY, WETM, and Time Warner Cable News on TV. In the event of an emergency during the school day, all students will be taken by bus to the address identified by parents on the "Emergency Go Home" form that was completed at the beginning of the school year. As a reminder, this location MUST be on one of the Big Flats Elementary bus routes.

Snow Days Impact our Schedule

When a snow day occurs and all schools in the District are closed, it changes our schedule. The next day that school is in session is the cycle 'Day' that the snow day would have been.

Swimming Unit Moves to 5th Grade in 2026-2027

As a part of our physical education curriculum, we have traditionally offered a swimming unit for our students during their fourth grade year. Due to ongoing construction and its impact on available teaching spaces at the high school, this unit will not be offered during the 2025-2026 school year. Current fourth graders will complete this important unit of study in fifth grade beginning in the 2026-2027 school year, and this unit will then remain a part of the fifth grade physical education curriculum moving forward. This will ensure that no students miss this important learning experience, while enabling us to streamline the travel and additional logistics that make this unit possible between the Intermediate School and High School.

Parents' Bill of Rights Relating to Student Data

The Horseheads Central School District, in compliance with Education Law 2-d, hereby establishes the following Parents' Bill of Rights in regard to student data:

- 1. A student's personally identifiable information will not be sold or released for any commercial purpose;
- 2. Parents have the right to inspect and review the complete contents of their child's educational record. Procedures for reviewing student records can be found in the Board Policy entitled 'Student Records,' Policy 5500, Regulation 5500-R;
- 3. Security protocols regarding confidentiality of personally identifiable information are currently in place and the safeguards necessary to protect the confidentiality of student data are maintained at industry standards and best practices. The safeguards include but are not limited to: encryptions, firewalls, and password protection.
- 4. New York State maintains a complete list of all student data collected by the State and the data is available for public review at www.nysed.gov, or by writing to: 89 Washington Avenue, Albany, NY 12234.
- 5. Parents have the right to have complaints about possible breaches of student data addressed. Complaints should be directed to the Superintendent of Schools, One Raider Lane, Horseheads, NY 14845.

Dear Big Flats Falcon Parents/Guardians:

On behalf of our BFE Parent Pick Up Team, we would like to thank you ALL for your support and patience with our end of the day pick up procedures! You all have done AMAZING with our traffic pattern. We have a few reminders to further expedite and ensure the safety of all our students, staff, and families:

- The earliest you may arrive on campus to line up is 3:00pm. We begin dismissal at approximately 3:20pm. Please do not arrive any earlier than 3:00pm as we are dismissing our PK students until approximately 2:45pm.
- Please keep your family name tent visible to ALL staff to ensure that we are getting each child to the correct parent/vehicle. You must have your provided family name tent, no homemade tents will be accepted. If you do not have your provided family name tent, please park and walk to the parent pick up line in front of the library. If you need a family name tent, please call our main office to request a set of two. Throughout the school year, we will have different BFE staff members assist with student pick up duty. Please continue to be patient and appreciative of our staff who do their best to ensure everyone gets home safely. Please let our staff know how much you appreciate them. A simple thank you goes a long way!
- Please pull up as close as you can to the car in front of you. Please do not pull forward to exit until released by either the School Resource Officer or a staff member.
- Please REMAIN in your vehicle. Please be sure that every child is properly restrained before being directed to pull forward. Please note, if
 your child needs assistance being secured in their child seat, please park in the main entrance, and pick your child up in the parent walkup line
 in front of the library.
- Please do NOT pass any vehicles and please stay in your lane!
- Please do NOT BLOCK the entrance/exit of our school campus to get in line. Obstructing the view on Maple Street is very dangerous for parents trying to pull out. Please be patient and wait your turn. If your vehicle cannot fit straight at the end of the line when entering our school campus, please wait!
- Please be courteous and take turns alternating east and west bound traffic when entering our campus.
- Please do NOT block the entrance of our neighbors' driveways. Please leave each driveway accessible so that our neighbors may enter and
 exit their homes safely. We appreciate our neighbors and want to always be respectful!
