#### Center Street Information

#### **BUILDING DOORS WILL BE LOCKED**

As part of the District-wide security system and our emphasis on safety, the building doors will be locked during the day. Both of the main lobby entrance doors have a white box. Please push the button, wait for a response and you will be buzzed into the building. We may ask you to look toward the camera or identify yourself by speaking into the white box. Once you enter the building, please report directly to the office to sign in and pick up a visitor's badge. You will need to be buzzed in for you to enter the office. Please push the door once you hear the buzz noise.

**Visitors to the Schools –** to maintain a safe place for our children to work and learn, certain limits must be set for visits by parents and other agencies. For these reasons, the following rules apply to ALL visitors to the school:

Access to the elementary building will be through the main entrance ONLY beginning at 7:45 AM.

ALL VISITORS ARE REQUIRED TO SIGN IN AT THE MAIN OFFICE IMMEDIATELY UPON ENTERING THE BUILDING TO RECEIVE A VISITOR'S PASS WHICH MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES WHILE IN THE SCHOOL OR ON THE SCHOOL GROUNDS.

Also, as parents arrive in the morning with children, please remain in the lobby area. Children must learn to proceed to their room on their own.

Teachers are expected NOT to take class time to discuss individual matters with visitors.

Visitors attending school functions that are open to the public such as parent teacher organization (PTO) meetings or public gatherings are not required to register.

Any consumables (food, beverages, etc.) brought in by visitors are subject to search and / or inspection.

Please note these district rules are approved by the Horseheads Board of Education. These safety procedures need your support. If you have any questions regarding these procedures, please call the office. Thank you in advance for your help

#### **GUIDELINES FOR CLASSROOM PARTIES / CELEBRATIONS**

Following the below practices will help to protect your children against food-borne illness. If bringing food to your child's class such as drinks, cakes or pastries, the following guidelines should be used:

Please notify the teacher and get their permission first. Immediately after cooking, if possible, items should be wrapped individually (i.e. cookies, muffins, cupcakes, etc.). The Chemung County Health department makes these additional requests:

COLD FOODS SHOULD BE REFRIGERATED IMMEDIATLEY AND HELD BELOW 45 DEGREES FAHRENHEIT. HANDS SHOULD BE WASHED BEFORE FOOD PREP AND THEN YOU SHOULD NOT TOUCH FOODS AFTER THEY ARE COOKED. GLOVES, TONGS OR DELI PAPER SHOULD BE USED SO THERE IS NO BAREHANDED CONTACT WITH FOOD AFTER PREPARATION.

\*TEACHERS DO NOT HAVE KNIVES OR UTENSILS IN THE CLASSROOM-SO PLEASE MAKE SURE ALL TREATS ARE PRE-CUT OR INDIVIDUALLY WRAPPED.

**MEDICATION IN SCHOOL** - If a student needs any form of medication at school, a written physician's prescription and written parental consent are necessary. Any medication should be brought in the original container to the health office by an adult where it will be stored and dispensed. APPR of Teacher and Principals - The District is required to implement Annual Professional Performance Reviews (APPR) of teachers and principals. The outcome of the APPR is that each teacher and principal will receive an Overall Composite Rating based upon Observation and Student Performance scores. The four possible Overall Composite Ratings are Highly Effective, Effective, Developing and Ineffective (HEDI). You may request the Overall Composite Rating for the teachers and principals in the school building to which your child is assigned for the current school year by contacting the building principal of your child's school. Further, if you require additional explanation of the ratings for the teachers and principals, you may contact Tony Gill, Assistant Superintendent, at 607-739-5601, x4263. Please note that this information may be released only to parents or legal guardians. The District will verify that any request received is a bona fide request submitted by a parent or legal guardian.



- Have lived in the district for at least 30 days prior to the vote
- Are not restricted from voting in general elections based on election law OR
- Are registered to vote in general elections



We will also have posters around the building reminding students of this.



# CENTER STREET ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PROJECT FAIR



WEDNESDAY, MAY 22, 2024

Projects are to be brought to school on Monday, May 20, 2024.

Projects done by our students will be on display for our students *only* to enjoy.

#### Turning CS into a museum for kids by kids!

#### <u>Project Fair 2024</u> <u>Wed., May 22, 2024</u>

#### <u>GRADE PRE K – "RAINBOWS"</u>

Individually students will create a rainbow. Students will use paints and paper. Students will create the project at school. Students will identify the different colors in a rainbow.

#### **GRADE K – "FARM ANIMALS"**

Students will create a farm or zoo at home. Students may use a variety of materials to demonstrate their knowledge of the types of animals that live on a farm.

#### **GRADE 1 – "SOUND AND RECYCLING"**

Students will create a project to display how vibration creates sounds. Students will use any recycled materials or and household items. Students will complete the project at home. Students must include at least one sentence they wrote to describe what creates the sound.

#### **GRADE 2 - " BOOK REVIEW"**

Second graders will work independently or with the assistance of family members at home to create your project. Please choose a book that you enjoy and create your favorite part of the story. Projects must include characters, setting, and show 1 event that happened in the story. This project can be created in different ways using items you have at home. Crayons, markers, paint, magazine pictures, or any craft supplies can be used. Projects must be no larger than a standard sized shoe box. (No boot boxes please.) Please make sure your child clearly labels the project with his/her name and includes the title and author of the book. Thank you!

#### **GRADE 3 – "FAST CHANGES ON LAND"**

Independently, third graders will construct an exhibit or display of a fast change on land. Research choices include volcano, earthquake, landslide, hurricane, tornado or avalanche. Students must include name of the fast change and label objects on the project. Students must include detailed sentences of possible destruction to the land.

#### **GRADE 4 – "NEW YORK STATE PROJECT"**

Students will demonstrate their knowledge of their selected New York State topic. Topics should focus on a New York State animal, Native American history, or the geography of New York State. Independently, students will research and create an exhibit - teaching others about their chosen topic. Students will be able to use a variety of materials they have available to create their exhibit.

#### PROJECT FAIR - MAY 22, 2024

#### **HELPFUL INFORMATION**

Each grade has a specific focus. Please see your child's grade level expectation.

Projects are required and part of their grades.

It supports our NYS Standards of Excellence at CS! Projects are due to the school by and no earlier than Mon., May 20, 2024. Individual projects must be no larger than an adult shoe box (not a boot size box please).

Projects should be able to **fit inside a shoe box with the lid on.** This way the cover will secure the pieces and it may be transported to and from school on the bus. *Please do not incorporate any glass with the projects*.

Students will be presenting their projects to their classrooms. It is part of our Speaking and Listening Standards. Presentations should not be longer than 5 minutes per student.
