#### Budget Vote/Board Election by Absentee Ballot This Year

In accordance with New York State Governor Andrew Cuomo's Executive Order, the Horseheads Central School District will hold the 2020-21 Budget Vote/Board of Education Election via absentee ballot only.

Ballots will be mailed to those eligible voters who voted in the 2019 annual vote. In addition, applications for absentee ballots may also be applied for at the office of the District Clerk for any qualified voter in the district who did not vote in the 2019 annual vote. Contact the District Clerk at 607-739-5601 ext. 4260 to schedule an appointment to complete the application for a ballot to be mailed to you. Such applications for an absentee ballot must be received by the District Clerk at least seven days before the vote if the ballot is to be mailed to the absentee voter or the day before the vote if the ballot is to be picked up by the absentee voter by scheduled appointment at the district office. Absentee ballots must be received in the office of the District Clerk, 143 Hibbard Road, Horseheads, NY 14845, not later than 5 p.m. on June 9 in order to be counted.

All district residents are eligible to vote, as long as they meet the following requirements:

- Are a U.S. citizen
- Are 18 years of age or older on the day of the vote
- Have lived in the district for at least 30 days prior to the vote
- Are not restricted from voting in general elections based on election law

#### **Trustworthiness - August**


- -Have a family game night

# **While School's Out**

#### Watch your child for signs of illness

If you see any sign of illness consistent with symptoms of COVID-19, particularly fever,

cough, or shortness of breath, call your health care provider and keep your child at home and away from others as much as possible. Follow the CDC's guidance on what to do if you are sick.

## Look for signs of stress in your child

Some common changes to watch for include excessive worry or sadness, unhealthy eating or sleeping habits, and difficulty with attention and concentration.

Take time to talk with your child or teen about the COVID-19 outbreak. Answer questions and share facts about COVID-19 in a way that your child or teen can understand.

## Teach and reinforce everyday preventive actions

Parents and caretakers play an important role in teaching children to wash their hands. Explain to them that handwashing can keep them healthy and stop the virus from spreading to others.

Be a good role model. If your children see you wash your hands often, they're more likely to do the same.

Make handwashing a family activity.



## Help your child stay active

Encourage your child to play outdoors. It's great for physical and mental health. Take a walk with your child or go on a bike ride.

Use indoor activity breaks (like stretch breaks or dance breaks) throughout the day to help your child stay healthy and focused.

#### Help your child stay socially connected

Reach out to friends and family via phone or video chats.

Write cards or letters to family members they might not be able to visit.

Some schools and nonprofits, such as the Collaborative for Academic, Social, and Emotional Learning and The Yale Center for Emotional Intelligence, have resources for social and emotional learning. Check to see whether your school has tips and guidelines to help support social and emotional needs of your child.

## **Technology Help**

#### **During the 2020 Extended Student Dismissal**

### Wi-Fi hot spots available beginning May 27

In our continued efforts to provide students with internet access during the extended student dismissal, the Horseheads district will be offering the use of internet hot spots for students who need to connect to download and/or upload assignments. These hot spots will be available **beginning Wednesday, May 27**.

Please note: These hot spots are meant for students to download and/or upload materials and then leave the area to do the assignments at home or elsewhere. Please do not stay for extended periods of time.

#### Standalone hot spot in Erin

There will be a standalone hot spot at the Erin Fire Department available from 8am to 5pm. Please use the side parking lot and please **do not block** the front doors of the fire station.

#### Mobile hot spots from district buses in three locations

Beginning Wednesday, May 27, the district will provide mobile hotspots from three bus locations in the farther edges of our district. Look for the Horseheads buses at the following sites:

- → Park Station Fishing Launch parking area
- → Millport parking area on Crescent Street
- → Whitney Park parking area near Sing Sing Road and Chambers Road intersection

#### Important Notes for bus hot spots:

- Buses will be in these locations Monday through Friday from 8-10am and from 1-3pm.
- Park near the bus, but **do not block the front or rear of the bus**. The bus will be running so there will be exhaust.
- Depending on the strength of the signal, you can park up to 20 yards away. Please do not get closer than 15 feet to the bus. In order to get the best signal, please consider a different time if there are more than five cars around the bus.
- The buses use a cellular signal projected from the bus to provide internet access. Note that cellular signals vary, and you may experience slowness or some intermittent signals.
- The bus driver is not a technician and will not be able to assist you with the connection to the hot spot.
- No one but the driver is allowed on the bus at these hot spots.

#### Network access outside buildings

The most reliable options for access are the parking lots at our four elementary schools and district office. Big Flats, Center Street, Gardner Road, Ridge Road, and District Offices (143 Hibbard Road, Horseheads) provide a signal for students to connect to our network. Connection at these locations is available from 7am to 9pm.

#### **Important Notes for hot spots**

- We recommend using a laptop rather than a tablet or smartphone to make the best connection.
- District-owned laptops will automatically connect to the Regional Network when within range.
- If using a personal laptop, the student will connect to the BYOD-HH when in range. If not prompted automatically, please open a browser (using Chrome or Edge). The student will be prompted to enter their network credentials. These are the same credentials our students use to access school accounts (lastname-firstname and password).
