PUBLIC HEARING, CANDIDATES' FORUM, BUDGET VOTE PLEASE VOTE MAY 16

23-24 BUDGET VOTE/BOARD OF EDUCATION ELECTION IS TUESDAY, MAY 16, FROM 7AM TO 9PM IN THE HORSEHEADS HIGH SCHOOL SOUTH GYM.

All district residents are eligible to vote, as long as they meet the following requirements: are a U.S. citizen, are 18 years of age or older on the day of the vote, have lived in the district for at least 30 days prior to the vote on May 16, and are not restricted from voting in general elections based on election law. You do not have to be registered in general elections or own property in order to vote. VOTE ON DISTRICT IMAGE MAY 16

You do not need to vote on the budget to vote for a district image.

HEALTH OFFICE NEWS

9th and 11th Grade Physicals

New York State law requires a health examination for all students entering 9th and 11th grade. The examination must be completed by a New York State licensed physician, physician assistant, or nurse practitioner. A physical dated on or after September 6, 2022, is acceptable. The physical can be faxed to the Health Office at 795-2510, emailed to ctournour@gstboces.org or vwhite@gstboces.org, or brought into the Health Office.

Sports & Physicals

Sports physical registration on Family ID is from July 1^{st} to July 31^{st} at noon. Family ID can be accessed on the Horseheads District website under Athletics. Physicals will be done on August 2^{nd} from 8am to 12pm in the High School Health Office.

A physical dated on or after August 1, 2022, is needed for a Fall 2023 sport. The sport physicals provided by the school are for students who do not

have a primary care provider. Varsity and JV Fall Sports registration begins July 22^{nd} and Varsity and JV Practice/tryouts begin August 21^{st} .

Medication Pick-up

New York State requires that all the medication left at school at the end of the school year be discarded. This includes inhalers and Epi-pens. All medication needs to be picked up by an adult. If you need to make special arrangements to pick up medication, please call the Health Office at 795-2512. Medication not picked up will be disposed of on June 21, 2023 by 11:30 am.

Class of 2024 MENINGOCOCCAL VACCINE BOOSTER

Parents/Guardians:

Please note before school this September:

- Your 12th-grader must receive a booster of the meningococcal vaccine (unless the first dose was received after turning 16). This booster is required because protection from the vaccine decreases over time.
- If your child had one or two doses of the meningococcal vaccine prior to their 16th birthday, he/she must have a second dose to begin school in September*.
- The vaccine may be given by your primary provider or the Chemung County Health Department. For information on how to get the vaccine at the Health Department and insurance coverage, call (607)737-2028.

About the Vaccine:

- It's not a new vaccine; it has been recommended for a decade.
- Most parents already choose to vaccinate their children.
- The meningococcal vaccine has been required for school entry since Sept. 1, 2016.

About Meningococcal Disease:

- It causes bacterial meningitis and other serious diseases.
- Teens and young adults are at greater risk.
- It comes on quickly and without warning.
- Its symptoms are similar to the flu.
- Every case of this disease can result in death or long-term disability.

*Public Health Law requires that all students meet immunization requirements. Students transferring within New York State have 14 calendar days to submit required immunizations. Students transferring from out of state or out of country have 30 days to submit required immunizations.
