- **1.** Applications for assistance from the **Arctic League** are available in the Office. If interested, please stop by or call for more information.
- **2. Report cards will be mailed home on Friday, December 11**<sup>th</sup>. We have a 3-Tiered Honor Roll System and will recognize students who have a grade point average (GPA) of **85.0** or higher and do not fail any classes. Students achieving a GPA of 85.0-89.99 will be recognized as Honor Roll, 90.0-94.99 will get High Honors, and 95.0 or above will be recognized as Distinguished Honor Roll.
- 3. For this school year, special area classes (PE, art, and music) will be graded with an H (95 or higher), G (80 94.99), S(65 79.99), or U (below 65). These grades are not weighted into the overall average. Students must pass all subject areas to be considered eligible for any of the honor roll tiers.
- **4.** A study has found that **irregular bedtimes** can lead to behavioral problems. <u>Click here.</u>
- 5. We will have a **Canned Food Drive** for our local Horseheads Food Pantry sometime in late winter or early spring when their supplies often run low.
- **6.** Reminder that recess is outside when weather permits. Please be sure that your child wears an appropriate jacket when we return to in-person classes.
- 7. We thank all the parents who will participate in **Parent Teacher Conferences** this month. Communication with home is essential. Please contact your child's homeroom teacher to monitor your child's progress throughout the year or if you have any other questions. Parent Portal is always available as well.
- **8.** Please encourage your child to **read at home**. Our Goal is for all students to read three books each month in order to reach the goal of 25 books for the year.

#### HANDLING NON PA YMENT OF MEAL CHARGES

#### **BOARD OF EDUCATION POLICY:**

The Board of Education recognizes that on occasion, students may not have enough funds for a meal. To ensure that students do not go hungry, but also to promote responsible student behavior and minimize the fiscal burden to the District, the Board will allow students who do not have enough funds to "charge" the cost of meals to be paid back at a later date subject to the terms in this policy.

A student may charge up to ten reimbursable meals. The District may allow additional reimbursable meals to be charged when extenuating circumstances exist. Extra items such as à la carte items and snacks may not be charged.

No student with unpaid charges will be prohibited from purchasing food if they have money on a particular day.
