Drop-Off and Pick-Up Procedures



Due to the large volume of students being dropped off and picked up, the line can become very long. We ask that you help alleviate unnecessary wait time by following these simple procedures:

- **Utilize the entire drop-off lane**

- ⇒ Please do not wait until you have pulled up to the middle school entrance to drop off your student
- ⇒ Approximately ten cars can drop off simultaneously
- ⇒ Please use caution when utilizing the passing lane to pull around cars dropping off students
- ⇒ Students should exit the vehicle as soon as it is safely stopped
- ⇒ Please be sure students have all of their belongings ready to go

- **Do not drop students off in the staff or visitor parking lots**

- **Do not drop students off on Sing Sing Road**


- **Students should walk in the door no later than 7:40 to avoid being late to first period**

Pick-up procedures:

Do not wait in the drop-off lane or any of the driving lanes in the parking lot.

Please park in the upper parking lot and wait for your student to walk to your car

- Using a consistent parking spot or general area, will help facilitate the pick-up process
- Students will cross to the parking lot using the crosswalk nearest the Intermediate School



Health Unit Notification

During the last marking period of each semester, seventh grade health classes will be studying the Human Physiology Unit. This is an abstinence-based unit which will include the male and female reproductive systems, conception and birth, the risks of teen pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases, including HIV/AIDS and HIV/AIDS prevention.

You have the option of exempting your child from the HIV/AIDS prevention information. However, we strongly encourage your child to participate. HIV information must be presented to every child by State mandate. Therefore, it is the parent's responsibility to provide this information which will be included in the Health final. If a student is exempted, he/she is assigned to a study hall and required to do an independent study unit in health.



The “Fish”monger’s Philosophy

What’s a fishmonger, you ask? A person who sells fish of course! In 1930s Seattle, Washington, a fish-market stall opened at the Pike Place Market. The Pike Place Fish Company served its customers well for decades. When former employee, now owner, John Yokoyama, began to stir the pot, he found a better way for his employees to enjoy their job. The self-proclaimed World Famous Pike Place Fish Market became known as the place where the fishmongers threw fish — literally! The fishmongers put on a show that the customers loved. They would throw whole fish across their stall, sometimes to the customer. Each transaction became a positive, uplifting experience for everyone. The fish market became one of Seattle’s top tourist attractions. How did this happen? Fish Philosophy, of course.

The workers there found that four basic principles were their key to success:

Be there in the moment (for their customers)

Play (by putting on a show)

Make their day (involving the customers)

Choose your attitude (how do you want to feel?)




Hello! Every month our school newsletter highlights those in our HMS community that are caught doing something above and beyond and go that extra mile.

Student Information - *Protect Your Laptop*



10 Tips for Students

HANDLE WITH CARE

Avoid carrying the laptop by the screen. Always close the lid gently and carry it with both hands or have a dedicated spot in your school bag.

AVOID EXTREME TEMPERATURES

Do not leave the laptop in very hot or cold environments, such as a car, as extreme temperatures can damage the battery and other components.

TURN OFF YOUR LAPTOP WHEN YOU STORE IT

Before placing your laptop in a school bag, be sure to turn it off completely. Heat generated by the laptop could damage the battery or other internal hardware. Additionally, do not leave a running laptop on your bed, sofa, or thick carpeting, which could trap heat in the laptop.

BE MINDFUL OF CABLES

Ensure that power and peripheral cables are not stretched or tangled, which can cause ports to become loose or damaged.

USE ON STABLE SURFACES

Place the laptop on a flat, stable surface when in use to prevent it from falling.

KEEP FOOD & DRINKS AWAY

Avoid eating or drinking near the laptop to prevent spills that could damage the keyboard and internal components

CLEAN PROPERLY

Use a soft, dry cloth to clean the screen and keyboard. Avoid using harsh chemicals or sprays directly on the laptop.

BACK UP DATA

Regularly back up important schoolwork and files to your OneDrive to prevent data loss in case of damage

REPORT ISSUES PROMPTLY

If the laptop shows signs of damage or malfunction, report it to the school's IT department immediately for repair.

BE AWARE OF OTHERS' DEVICES

Please be careful with other students' school bags as there may be a device inside. Also, if you see a device left behind or not attended, please take to the school's main office.



aimsweb Plus is a reliable computer-based screening assessment, which is administered in the fall, winter and spring. This year on **January 8th and 9th**, students will be taking the **winter** *aimsweb* Plus benchmark assessments in reading and math. *aimsweb* Plus allows us to monitor our students in reading and math and provides us with valuable information we can use to make educational decisions for our students. Results will be shared with parents and students three times per year. Our goal is for each student to demonstrate academic growth from fall to winter and winter to spring. No special preparation for the *aimsweb* Plus testing is required.

Information about Emergency School Closings/Delays

Schools are closed when the weather makes it impossible to have reasonable attendance or when the schools or vehicles would not be able to operate safely. The school day is delayed when inclement weather conditions improve by early morning. Inclement weather may include snow, ice, and freezing temperatures. If the school day is delayed, buses will run and schools will open two hours later than the usual time.

The district announces school closings and delays in a variety of ways:

- **Text messaging** – Parents/guardians can receive a text message if schools are closed or delayed by opting in to our text messaging service through SchoolMessenger. To opt in, text Y or Yes to 67587. You will receive a text response confirming that you are registered for texting.

- **District Facebook pages** (the district and all seven schools have pages)

Note: Television and radio stations also put closing/delay information on their websites.

Please do not call the radio/TV stations or the district's Transportation Office.

Important notes about school closings/delays:

- There may be a time when any of these means of communication do not work due to Internet or other issues, so we ask that you check more than one of our communication methods to determine if school is in regular session or not for that day.
- If schools are closed, they will remain closed all day for scheduled activities, including remedial programs, extra-curricular activities, use of facilities by non-school groups, and evening programs.
- When school is delayed, there is no supervision for students until schools open two hours later than the usual time, so parents should not drop their children off at school until they open. Additionally, on school delays, there is no breakfast served.
- On school delays, prekindergarten begins at 10:30am.
- If a storm develops after school begins, usual procedure is NOT to close school early. This allows time for highway crews to plow and sand the roads and has proved to be less disruptive and confusing than attempting to send students home early.

School/District Communication

Information on SMS text messaging and Short Codes:

Our notification provider, SchoolMessenger, uses a true SMS protocol developed by the telecommunications industry specifically for mass text messaging, referred to as "short code" texting. This method is fast, secure and highly reliable because it is strictly regulated by the wireless carriers and only allows access to approved providers. If you've ever sent a text vote for a TV show to a number like 46999, you have used short code texting.




