Budget Vote/Board of Education Election vote will take place on Tuesday, May 19, 2026, from 7:00am - 9:00pm at the high school north gym.

All district residents are eligible to vote, provided they meet the following requirements:

- Are a U.S. citizen
 - Are 18 years of age or older on the day of the vote
 - Have lived in the district for at least 30 days prior to the vote
 - Are not restricted from voting in general elections based on election law
- OR
- Are registered to vote in general elections

National Junior Honor Society Update

Celebrating Excellence

To be selected for membership in the National Junior Honor Society (NJHS) is one of the highest honors a middle school student can achieve. It reflects a commitment to academic success and strong character. Horseheads Middle School is proud to recognize and celebrate our students who are honored with this prestigious award. Both seventh- and eighth-grade students are eligible but may only be inducted once.

Selection Criteria

To be nominated, students must first meet the academic requirement of a cumulative GPA of 90 or higher over the first three marking periods of the school year. Academic achievement, however, is only one of the criteria. To be selected, students will be assessed on their achievements on all five NJHS pillars of education: scholarship, leadership, service, character, and citizenship.

Administration will review students to ensure they meet behavioral expectations, while the Faculty Council will carefully evaluate each candidate's demonstration of the NJHS pillars. Students who are nominated will then complete an application and compose an essay. This thoughtful process ensures that selected students not only excel in the classroom but also represent the values and character that define NJHS.

Important Timeline

- April – Eligible students identified by staff
- Late April – Invitations and application materials sent home
- May – Applications due and selection process completed
- Late May – Notification of selection
- June – Induction Ceremony

Looking Ahead

Students selected for NJHS will continue to grow as leaders and serve both the school and community. We look forward to celebrating their achievements at this year's induction ceremony.

aimsweb Plus is a reliable computer-based screening assessment, which is administered in the fall, winter and spring. This year on **May 27th and 28th**, students will be taking the **spring** *aimsweb* Plus benchmark assessments in reading and math. *aimsweb* Plus allows us to monitor our students in reading and math and provides us with valuable information we can use to make educational decisions for our students. Results will be shared with parents and students three times per year. Our goal is for each student to demonstrate academic growth from fall to winter and winter to spring. No special preparation for the *aimsweb* Plus testing is required.

Our notification provider, SchoolMessenger, uses a true SMS protocol developed by the telecommunications industry specifically for mass text messaging, referred to as "short code" texting. This method is fast, secure and highly reliable because it is strictly regulated by the wireless carriers and only allows access to approved providers. If you've ever sent a text vote for a TV show to a number like 46999, you have used short code texting.

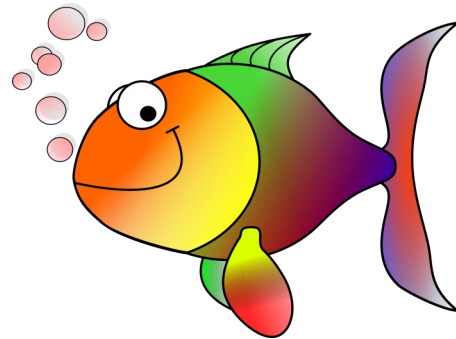
