All exams will be given on the date posted. Tests will not be rescheduled for any reason. No exams will be given early and a missed exam must be completed on the make-up days.

Living Environment students will take the Living Environment Regents Exam on June 17th at 12:00 PM. Algebra I students will take the Algebra I Regents Exam on June 18th at 12:00 PM.

Algebra and/or Living Environment students are not required to take the grade eight math and/or science exam. Students will go to an alternate location during the exams for independent study time.

National Junior Honor Society (NJHS)

Students meeting the initial screening criteria **will be invited to apply** for the National Junior Honor Society. The criteria is listed below:

1. Students must achieve an average of 90% or higher in all of the following subjects:

English Foreign Language Math Science Social Studies

2. Students must demonstrate the following characteristics:

Create enthusiasm for scholarship Stimulate a desire to render service Promote leadership Encourage responsible citizenship Develop and maintain good character

Once **students receive their invitation to apply**, they must complete an online application and attend an informational meeting. Applicants are then reviewed by the NJHS faculty selection committee. Successful candidates will receive an acceptance letter and invitation to the ceremony in late May. Students will remain members of the NJHS as long as they continue to uphold the high standards of the society.

8th Grade Awards

President's Award for Educational Excellence

Students must maintain an average of 90% or higher in math, English, science, social studies and foreign language over the course of seven marking periods at the middle school.

Highest Average Award

Triple C Award

Each 8th-grade team nominates a student who they feel best meets the criteria of commitment, character and courage. These students are honored with a certificate from the Attorney General of New York State.

Art Award

Middle School art teachers select two students who demonstrate excellence in the area of art. Students will have their artwork framed and displayed at the middle school.

This year on **May 28th and 29th**, students will be taking the **spring** *aimsweb* Plus benchmark assessments in reading and math. *aimsweb* Plus allows us to monitor our students in reading and math and provides us with valuable information we can use to make educational decisions for our students. Results will be shared with parents and students three times per year. Our goal is for each student to demonstrate academic growth from fall to winter and winter to spring. No special preparation for the aimsweb Plus testing is required.
