BOOKS

FORMAT: BOOK

Author (last name, first). Title (Underlined). Place (always a city): Publishing Company, Copyright Date.

BOOK BY ONE AUTHOR

Reiss, Bob. The Coming Storm: Extreme Weather and Our Terrifying Future. New York:
Hyperion, 2001.

The most violent storm on earth is a tornado with winds as high as 300 miles per hour (Reiss 7).

or

According to Bob Reiss, a tornado can reach speeds of 300 miles per hour (7).

BOOK BY TWO OR THREE AUTHORS

Nielsen, Jerry, and Maryanne Vollers. Ice Bound: a Doctor's Incredible Battle for Survival at the South Pole. New York: Hyperion, 2001.

The 62nd Airlift Wing at McChord Air Force Base near Tacoma, Washington was assigned to make the airdrop of medical supplies (Neilsen and Vollers 224).

or

Kerszner, Laurie G., and Stephen R. Mandell. The Brief Holt Handbook. Third Edition.
Ft. Worth, TX: Harcourt College Publishers, 2001.

BOOK BY MORE THAN THREE AUTHORS

If a book has more than three authors, use the first author followed by et al. Et al. is Latin for "and others". Example: Smith, Charles, et al., then complete the citation as you would a book by two or more authors.

ANONYMOUS WORK

This Fabulous Century: 1960-1970. Alexandria, VA: Time-Life Books, 1987.

COLLECTIONS – AUTHOR OF INDIVIDUAL CHAPTER, EDITOR OF BOOK

Eble, Kenneth. “A Forgotten Novel.” Kate Chopin. Edited with an introduction by Harold Bloom. New York: Chelsea, 1987. 7-16.

BOOK IN A SERIES

Allaby, Michael. Floods. Dangerous Weather. New York: Facts on File, 1998.

BOOK WITH A TITLE IN A TITLE

Grebstein, Sheldon Norman. “Hemingway’s Use of Details.” Readings on A Farewell to Arms. Gary Wiener, Book Editor. San Diego, CA: Greenhaven, 2000. 139-141.

Titles of books within titles are not underlined. Titles of poems and stories within titles have quotation marks around them.

Cite pamphlets as you would books.

REFERENCE BOOKS

FORMAT: REFERENCE BOOK

Author of article (if one is given). "Title of article or essay." Title of book (underlined). Edition (if there is one). Editor(s). Volume you used. Place: Publisher, date. Page #'s (if not in alphabetical order by subject.)

For familiar reference books that frequently appear in new editions, do not give full publication information.

For less familiar reference sources, give full publication information.

CONTEMPORARY AUTHORS
