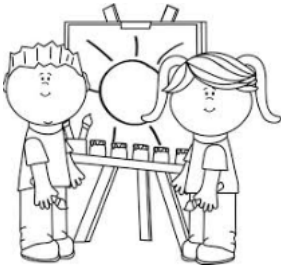


Pre-K Supply List 2020-2021

Dear Parents/Guardians:

The Kindergarten teachers would like to invite you and your child to a Sneak Preview of Kindergarten on Tuesday, September 8, 2020 from 2:30 to 3:00pm. We ask that you time your arrival for 2:30 p.m., as we will be preparing our rooms following our staff meetings.

The Sneak Preview helps alleviate some of the stress of the first day of school by allowing your child to meet the teacher, classmates and locate the room. You will have a chance to tour the room, help your child put supplies away and help them find their cubby and table. You will also have the opportunity to ask any questions that you may have.



Please bring all supplies to the Sneak Preview:

Hi everyone!

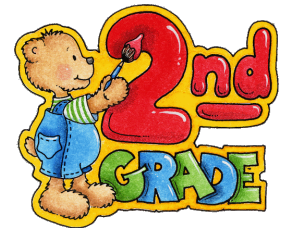

2020-2021 Third Grade Supply List



Please put the following supplies in a **soft** pencil pouch and bring to school:

- Clean, well fitted mask
- At least 5 **sharpened #2** pencils (Ticonderoga preferred)
- 2 highlighters
- 2 dry erase markers
- Sock or eraser for dry erase board
- Cap erasers
- Sharpened colored pencils or Twistables
- Pointed-tip scissors (at least 7-inch student scissors)
- 1 Glue Stick
- Small individual pack of tissues
- Small container of hand sanitizer

Other items that you should bring to school:

- 2 marble composition notebooks (hard covered, no spirals)

WELCOME

I am so excited to welcome you to our 12:1:1 classroom at Ridge Road Elementary. Below you will find a copy of this years school supply list for our classroom. This year, students are required to have individual supplies rather than the "shared" materials of the past.

Please reach out if you are unable to obtain any of these items for any reason.

1 container of Clorox wipes (does not need to be Clorox Brand. I know this one might be really tough and I have been trying to stock up all summer 😊)

1 container hand sanitizer (they have said that students can bring their own sanitizer to school. I would happily keep a bottle at school and let you know when it is empty). If you would like to send a small bottle to keep in their pencil box, that is up to you. Every parent knows what their student is capable of handling.

2 boxes of tissues

1 hard plastic pencil box (used to store all of their materials)

1 plastic shoe box (Since we are not able to share materials, I will be using the box to prep activities with manipulatives for each student, each day. The plastic box will hold all of their items for each lesson).

2 boxes of 24 count crayons

2 pack of 10 count markers

6 glue sticks

1 pack of colored pencils

1 box of quart size storage bags

1 box of gallon size storage bags

Plastic 2 Pocket Folders (with or without fasteners)

2 Red (Reading/Writing)

2 Blue (Math)

2 Yellow (Science/Social Studies)

2 Green (Take Home)

2 Composition Notebooks (2 different colors)

1 Writing Journal

1 Science Journal

2 1 ½ inch 3 ring binders (will be used for our reading curriculum. Any color is fine but make sure they are both the same color).

Daily snack- We will have snack as a class. Feel free to send bulk snacks. We will store them in the classroom and let you know when your student is close to being out. I will also have individually wrapped snacks in the classroom, if someone forgets 😊.

Please mark put 2 glue sticks, 1 box of crayons, and colored pencils inside of their pencil box labeled with their name. The rest of the supplies can be labeled and we will store them in the closet for when the box needs to be replenished. I have TONS of pencils and erasers and will be labeling them with your students names.
