Community Learning Pod

- This learning pod will be limited to 10 students, grades 1 through 5, from any area school district.
- The learning pod will be located in the former Southern Tier Pediatrics building, 254 E. First St., Corning, across the street from AIM's main offices. There is no public access to this site.
- It will be open from 8 a.m.-4 p.m. on weekdays beginning Sept. 14. Child care will not be available before or after the daily session.
- The fee is \$35 per student per day. Students do not have to attend all five days choose the number of days per week that works best for you and your student. However, during registration, families must commit to that number of days through December 2020. The pod will continue even if schools switch to fully online learning.
- We will follow Corning-Painted Post Area School District snow days and weather delays.
- AIM will host the learning pod and provide reliable Wi-Fi. AIM staff will provide supervision and tech support while students learn remotely from their teachers.
- Students must be well-behaved. Significant behavioral issues will not be tolerated and may be grounds for separation.
- Students should bring a learning device (laptop, tablet) and charging cables, along with lunch and a water bottle. Parents provide transportation.
- Updated vaccination records are required. Students must get this year's flu shot. A nurse will not be on staff, so no medications can be given to students.
- There will be a daily temperature check and health screening. Students must bring and wear masks at all times when away from their personal desk area. They will be socially distanced when at their desks.
- Families must agree to a social distancing honor code, and commit to following local and state health guidelines. The learning pod requires trust and cooperation.
- Slots will be filled on a first-registered, first-served basis.
