Why do you love to create art?

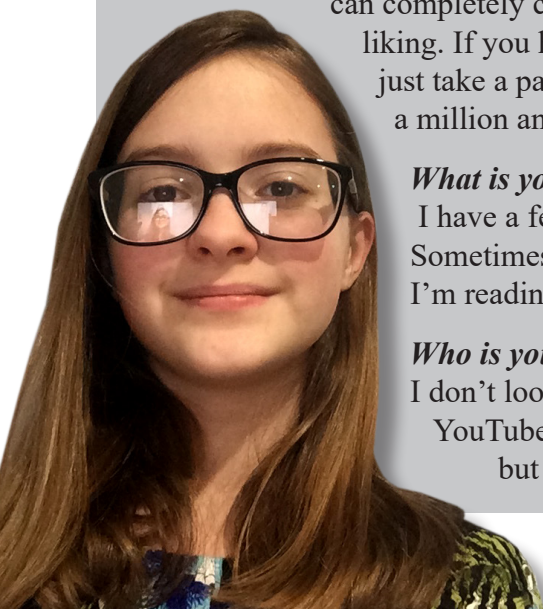
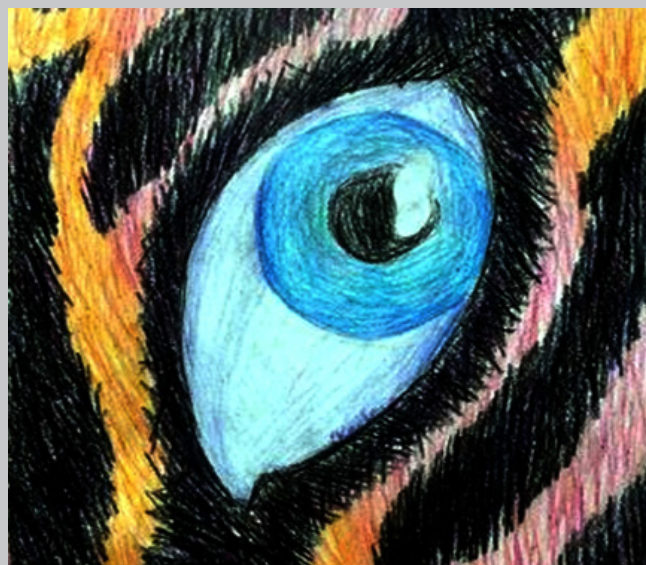
